Biblical/Hebrew Name	English Name	Time of Observance
1. Pesach	Passover	Nisan/Aviv 14
2. Hag HaMatzah	Feast of Unleavened Bread	Nisan/Aviv 15-21
3. Bikkurim	First Fruits of Barley Harvest	The morrow after the Sabbath during Hag HaMatzah
4. Shavuot	Feast of Weeks/Pentecost	50 days from the Feast of First Fruits
5. Yom Teruah (Rosh HaShanah)	Feast of Trumpets	Tishrei 1
6. Yom Kippur	Day of Atonement	Tishrei 10
7. Sukkot	Feast of Tabernacles/Booths	Tishrei 15-21
a. Shemini Atzeret	The 8 th assembly/conclusion	Tishrei 22
b. Simchat Torah	Rejoicing in the Torah	Tishrei 23

Feast	Historical Aspect	Messianic Fulfillment	Spiritual Application
Passover	Israel's deliverance out of Egyptian bondage	Death of Yeshua on the tree	Repent (teshucah) and trust by faith in the shed blood of Yeshua
Unleavened	The going out of Egypt	Burial of Yeshua	Sanctification & separation from evil represented by water immersion
1 st Fruits	Crossing the Red Sea	Resurrection of Yeshua	Walking in newness of Life
Pentecost	Giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai	Pouring out of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost)	Immersion in the Holy Spirit & growing in faith in God
Trumpets	Blowing the Shofar, Jewish New Year	The resurrection of the dead/rapture	Hear the calling of God for our lives
Atonement	Priest entered Holy of Holies, Cleansing/sins	Messiah's second coming	Yielding ourselves to God so we may live (face to face) in His presence
Tabernacles	Entering the Promised Land/Great Rejoicing	The Messianic era/Millennium	A daily rest in the Messiah & having rest of His Kingdom in our hearts
